He later explained that as a child he was not allowed to go to school because his parents thought he was mentally retarded. In 1987, he was charged with two counts of fraud but later pleaded guilty to only one count. Belfort was not fined or jailed. He was allowed to avoid jail time because he was cooperating with the FBI and providing intelligence about other stockbrokers. He made the decision to plead guilty after selling his stockbroking firm to another broker, according to the book. However, the Los Angeles Times later reported that Belfort was not cooperating with the FBI. Despite this, he was given a sentence of five years' probation and a \$10,000 fine. Belfort avoided jail time and chose to sell Stratton Oakmont 82157476af
